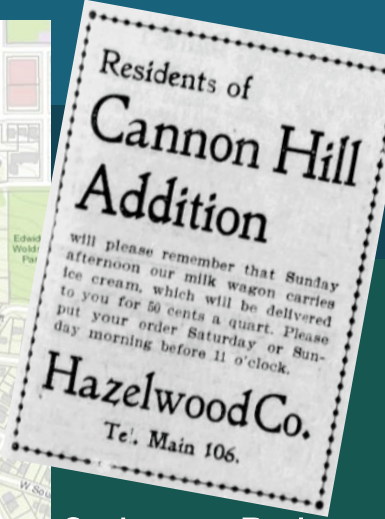
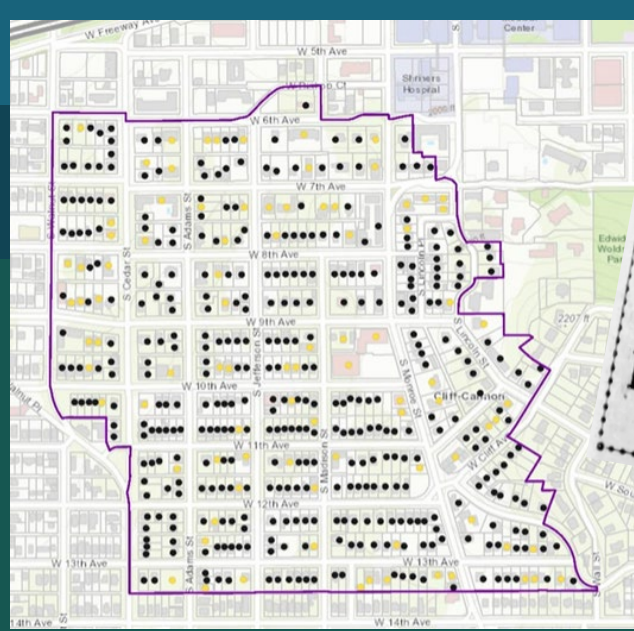

The Cliff/Cannon neighborhood on Spokane's lower South Hill could get historic protections – if homeowners want it

With its yellow trim and red brick columns, the Hans Moldenhauer House stands as a testament to the storied history of Spokane's historic Cliff/Cannon neighborhood.

Constructed in 1918, the home derives its name from one of its more remarkable owners, German musicologist Hans Moldenhauer.

Moldenhauer moved to Spokane in 1939 after fleeing Nazi Germany. Here, he founded the Spokane Conservatory and pursued his passions of collecting, performing, and composing music. At the time of his death in 1987, Moldenhauer had amassed thousands of fragments of music history, including the manuscripts of Brahms, Beethoven and other prominent composers. These documents are currently displayed around the globe, including at Harvard University and the Library of Congress.

Today, partners Ian White and Dustin Hall own the home, and are adding pages to its story. "Living here has really cemented how owners of older homes and older properties aren't really owners," White says, but are closer to "stewards of them through time."

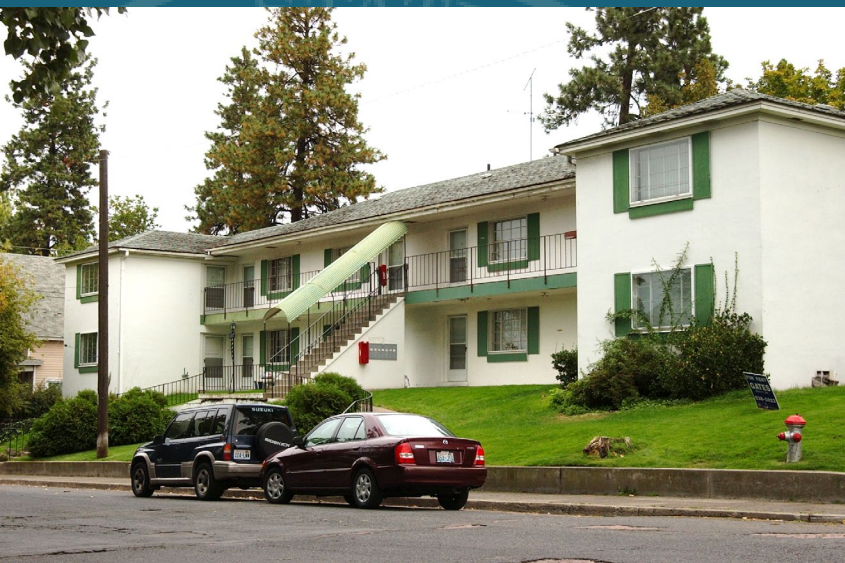
Fueled by this sentiment, White and Hall joined a grassroots effort earlier this year to register the neighborhood as a Spokane Historic District, which would aid in maintaining the neighborhood's aesthetic and grant historic property owners tax incentives to relieve costs of home restoration.

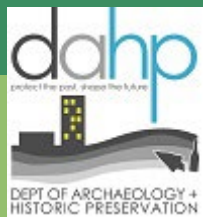


GOOD DEMAND FOR CANNON HILL LOTS

Downtown Wenatchee without Linda Haglund?

Linda Haglund has served as executive director of the Wenatchee Downtown Association since 2011. Her connection goes back to before she was even born.

Her parents met in downtown Wenatchee in 1947. The story goes like this: Molly Wright was waitressing at the Night and Day Café when a young lawman by the name of Ruben Rose stopped in for dinner. She waited on him, and he took a shine to her. They married on Valentine's Day in 1948. Their marriage would last 67 years and produce three children and a lot of happy memories, according to Linda, the youngest of the Rose kids. Her parents both passed in 2015.

Linda's official connection to downtown will end in February next year, when she retires from her job at the WDA.

We asked Linda about her lifelong connection to downtown, its challenges, its future and her motivation to retire. Here's a lightly edited transcript of the email conversation.

Padriac Slattery, a self-taught renovator, revives properties with inspiring mid century characteristics that eschew mainstream apartment construction and styling.

Slattery poured concrete flooring and added heavy skip-trowel wall texture—popular in California designs—to each Palm Court apartment. Plants like agave and yucca that thrive in dry climates and desert grass walkways ensure a drought-diversely landscape. Photo by Cleary O'Farrell.

What is a laundry angel you ask?

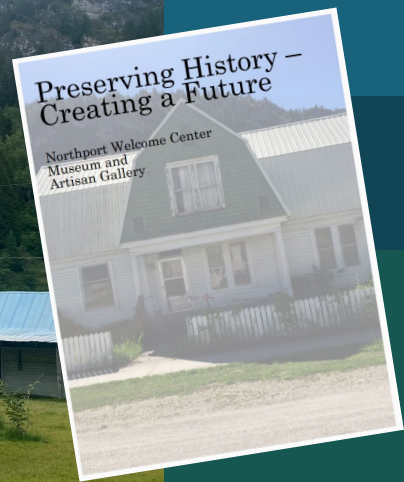
The National Guard arrives for one last time on June 11-23rd to help with the final phase of renovations for the Welcome Center project.
