## ARTICLE III OF THE BY-LAWS

**Section 1. Council Record.** In order to facilitate the transfer of registration credit from one State to another, the Council shall make a careful disinterested investigation of an applicant's training, practice, and character, the results of which shall be bound into a sealed and certified report, called the "Council Record" of the person in question. This record, together with all completed forms and State fees, shall be forwarded to the registration board in the State to which transfer is desired.

**Section 2. Transfer of Credit.** The collecting and furnishing of information regarding any applicant shall be solely for the assistance of the examining boards in States where applications are made. The Council itself shall make no recommendations whatever as to disposition of these applications, but the State boards will be expected to give the information furnished them in a Council Record due consideration in passing upon the qualifications of an architect who applies on the basis of transfer of registration credit in another State.
