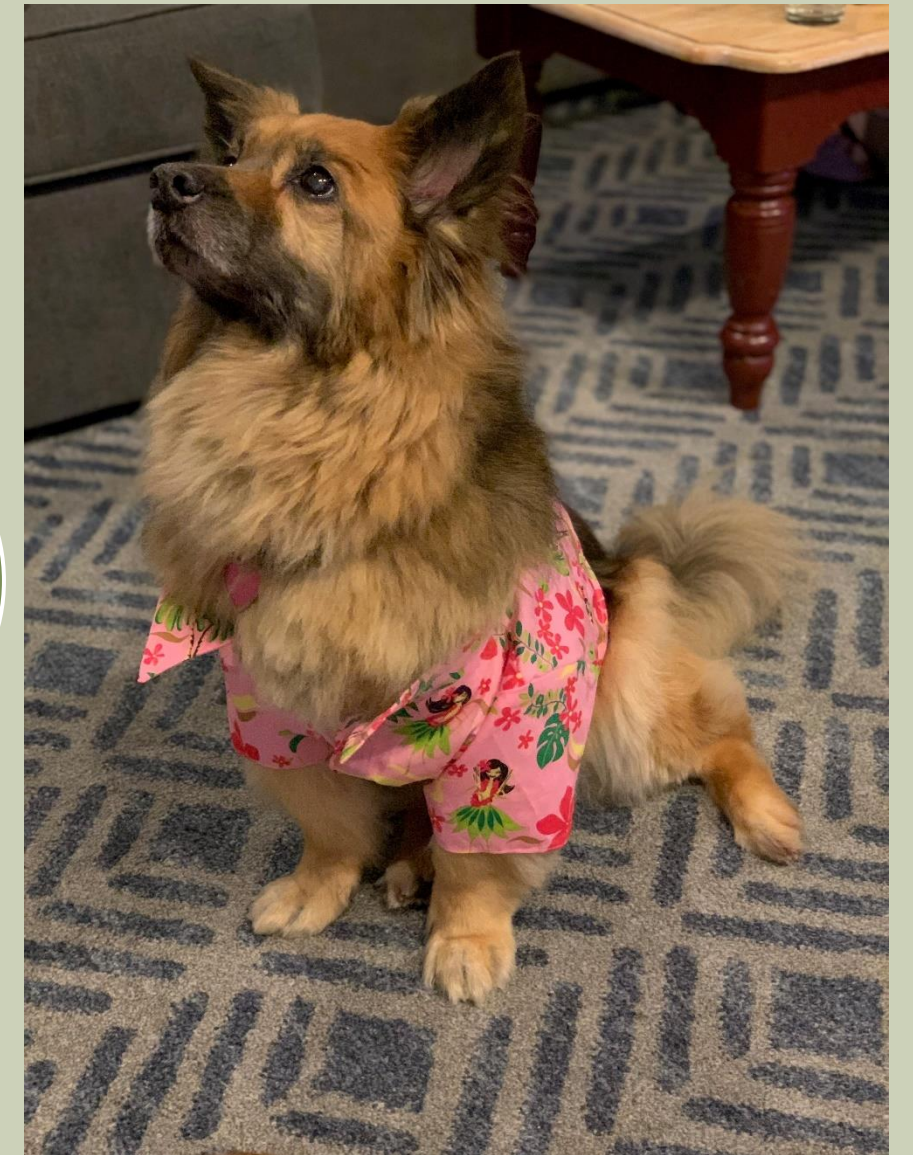
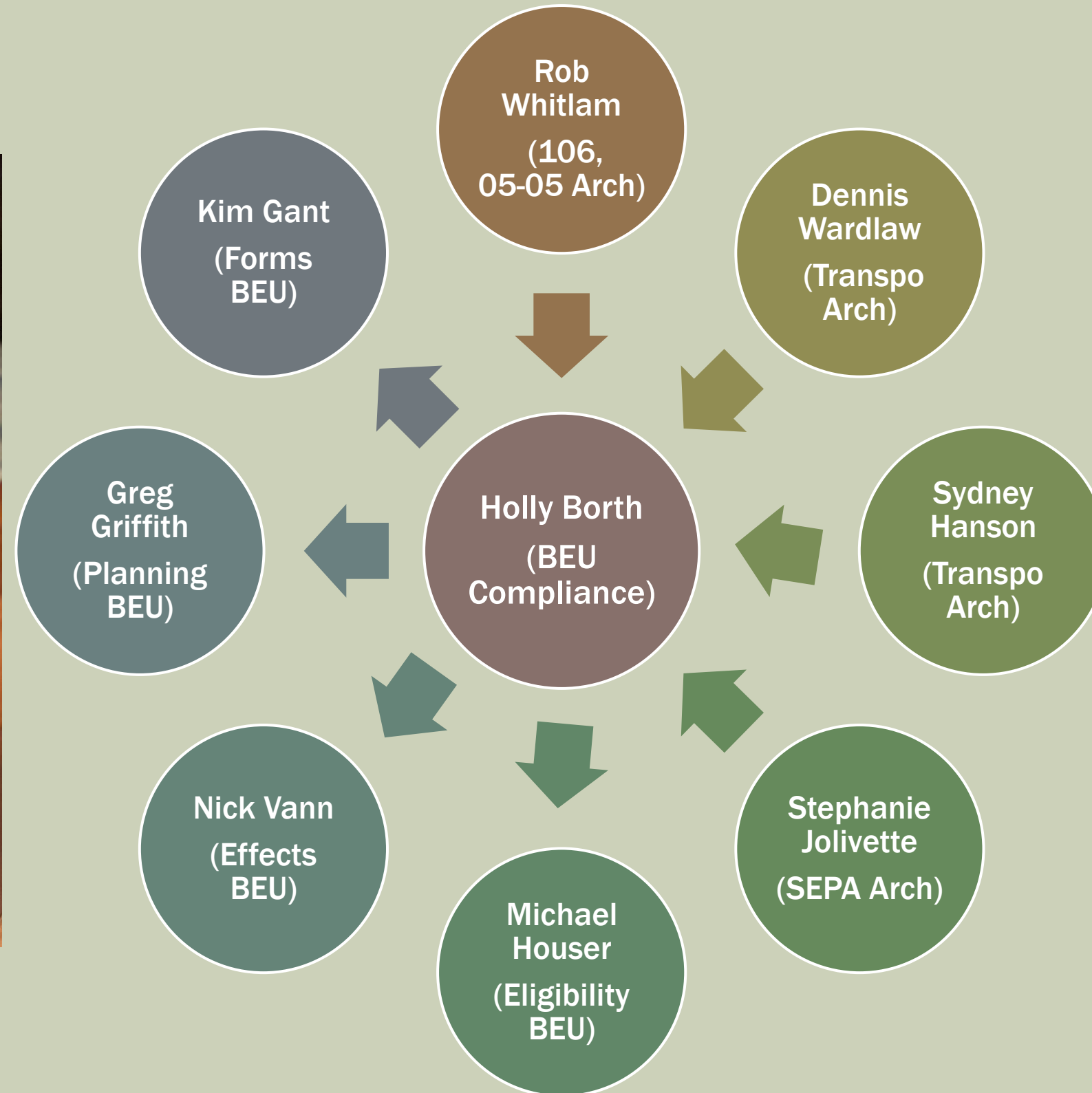

# DAHP CONSULTATION ORGANIZATION



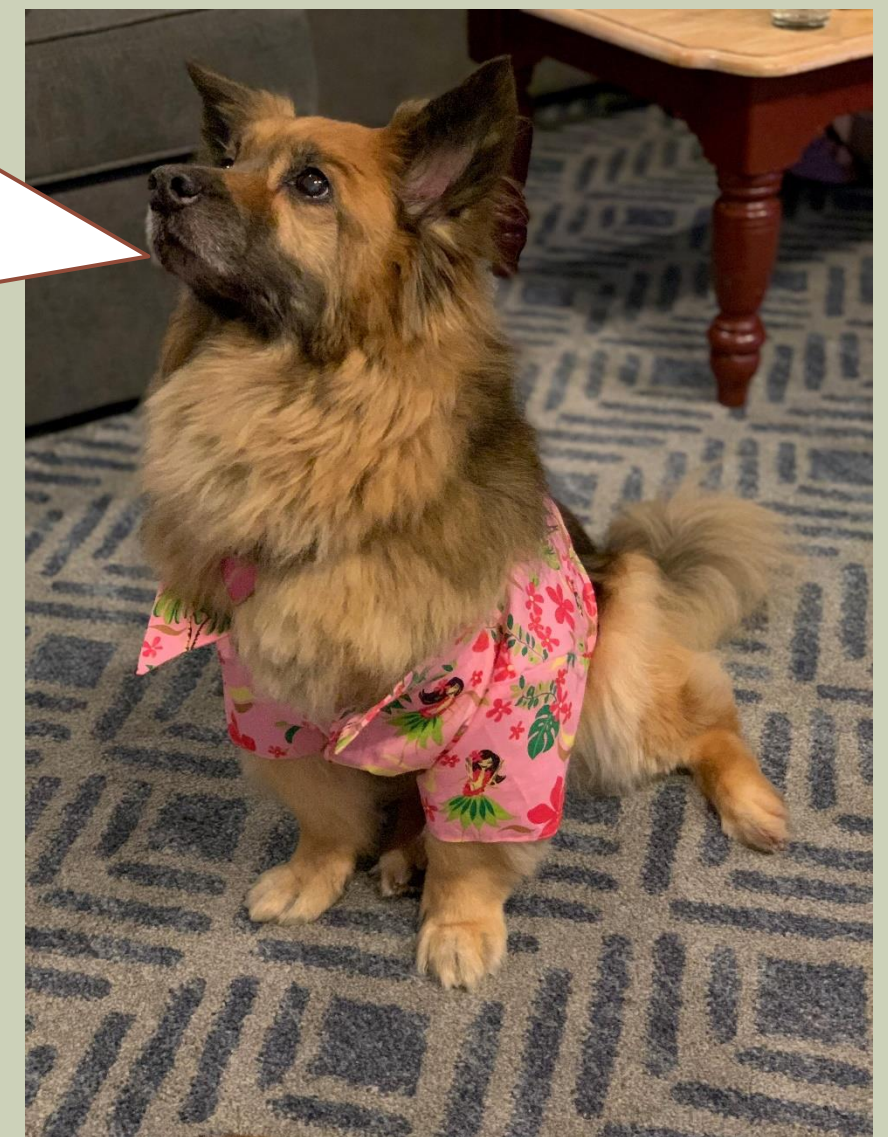


# SECTION 106

## 106@DAHP.WA.GOV

- **CONSULT** with the SHPO on the following, per 36 CFR 800.4:
  - Area of Potential Effects
    - Include description and justification
    - One size does not fit all
  - Methodology
    - Include justification
  - Eligibility
    - 4 Criteria
    - 7 Aspects of Integrity
  - Effects
    - “When an undertaking may alter, directly or indirectly, any of the characteristics of a historic property that qualify the property for inclusion in the National Register in a manner that would diminish the integrity of the property’s location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, or association
  - Resolution of Adverse Effects

# GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER 05-05

## 0505@DAHP.WA.GOV

- **State Capital Funding**
  - Requires ALL state agencies to **CONSULT** with DAHP, GOIA, and Tribes to consider how projects may impact significant cultural and historic places
- No specific process
  - Follow standard historic property protocol
  - Contact DAHP early and often – we are the only ones who can tell you what we want
- Cultural resource work must be commensurate with the scope of work
- EZ-1 for ground disturbing activities – first look
- EZ-2 for **NON-PROFESSIONALS** for built resources over 50 years in age (45 recommended)
  - Historic Property Inventory forms will be requested if a building is proposed for demolition
    - Must be completed by a cultural resource professional





# STATE ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT (SEPA)

## SEPA@DAHP.WA.GOV

- Local Jurisdictions are the decision makers
- SEPA Checklists are submitted to DAHP
  - DAHP will provide **COMMENTS** as necessary
- Final decisions are made by the local jurisdiction
- Each jurisdiction is different
- Demolition of NRHP listed properties will trigger review
- HPIs submitted are reviewed for completeness
  - DOEs made upon request of local jurisdiction

**\*\*\*Send to the appropriate regulatory inbox\*\*\***

## **INCLUDE:**

- Lead agency
- Regulatory context
- Project description
  - What are you consulting on?
- What do you need from DAHP?

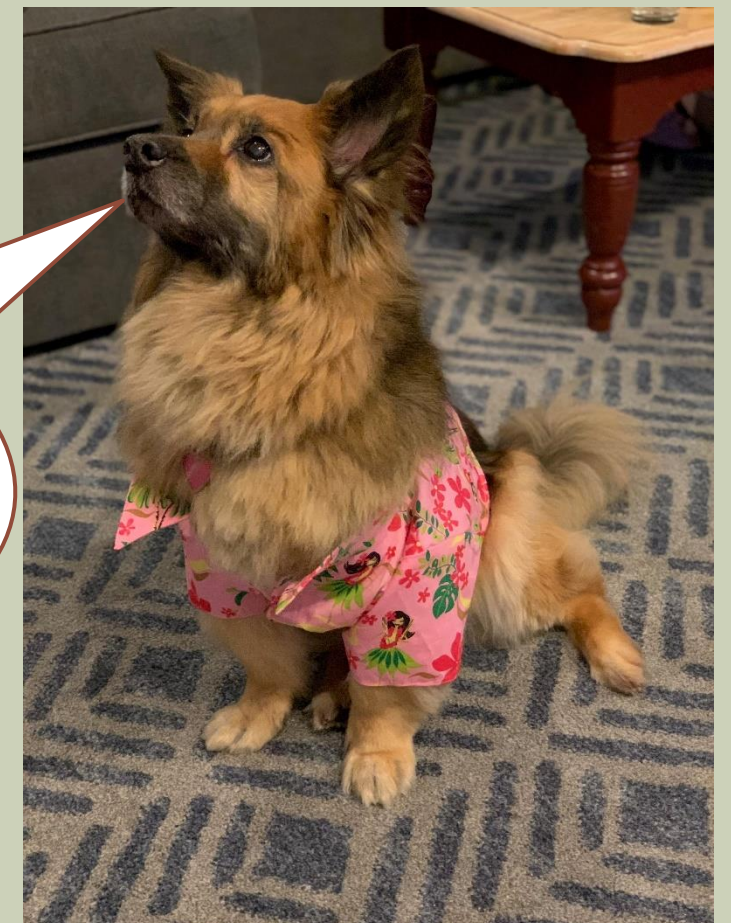


# REPORTING IN WISAARD

- If it's in your report, it should be in Wisaard
  - Including previous DOEs
- Consultation is **NOT** a Wisaard tool
  - Submitting into Wisaard does not initiate consultation
    - Email: 106@dahp.wa.gov; 0505@dahp.wa.gov; SEPA@dahp.wa.gov
    - If you know the right DAHP staff, you can **CC** them
  - Consultation letters stay out of Wisaard

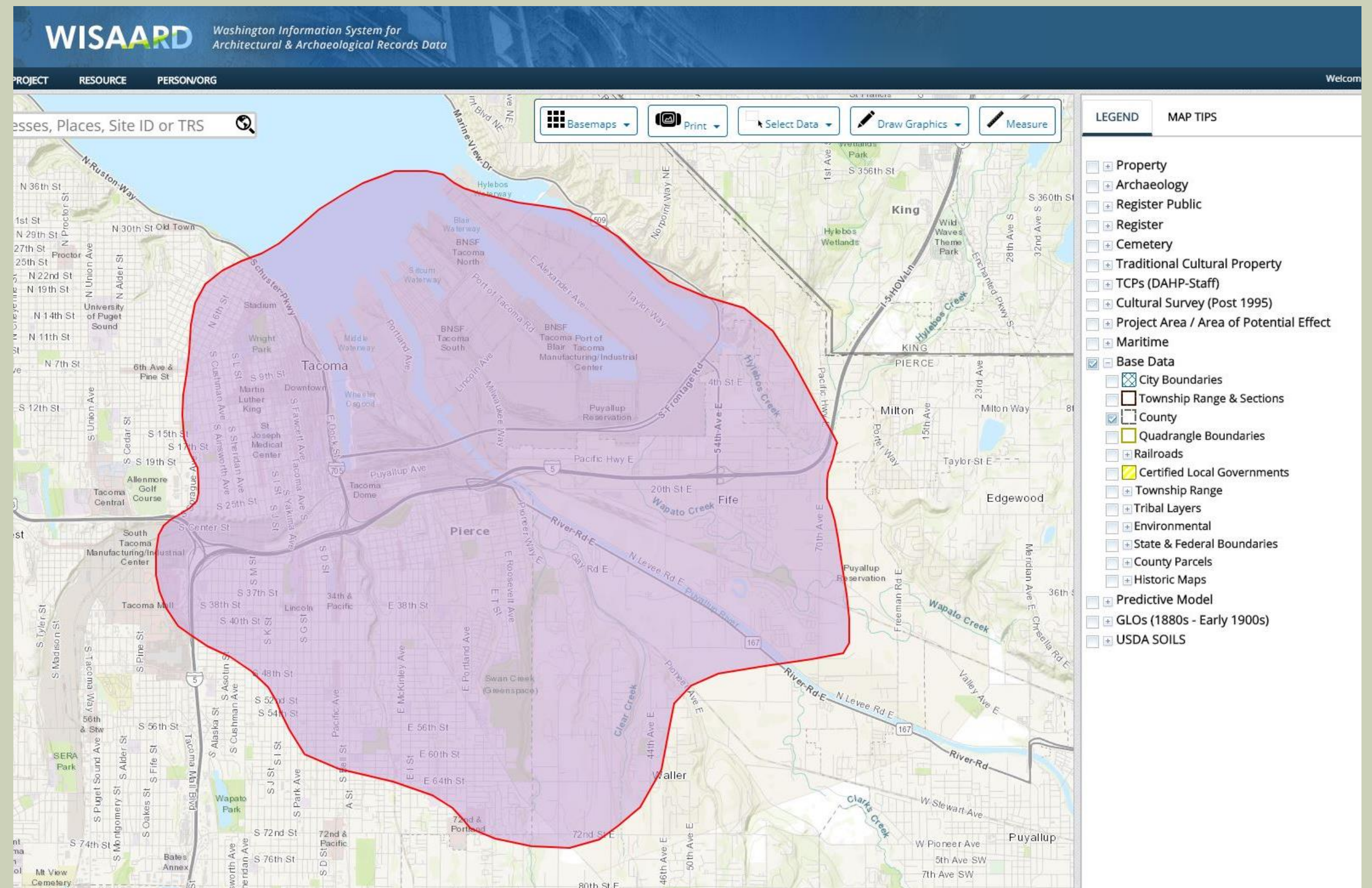
# AREA OF POTENTIAL EFFECT/IMPACT

How was it defined?

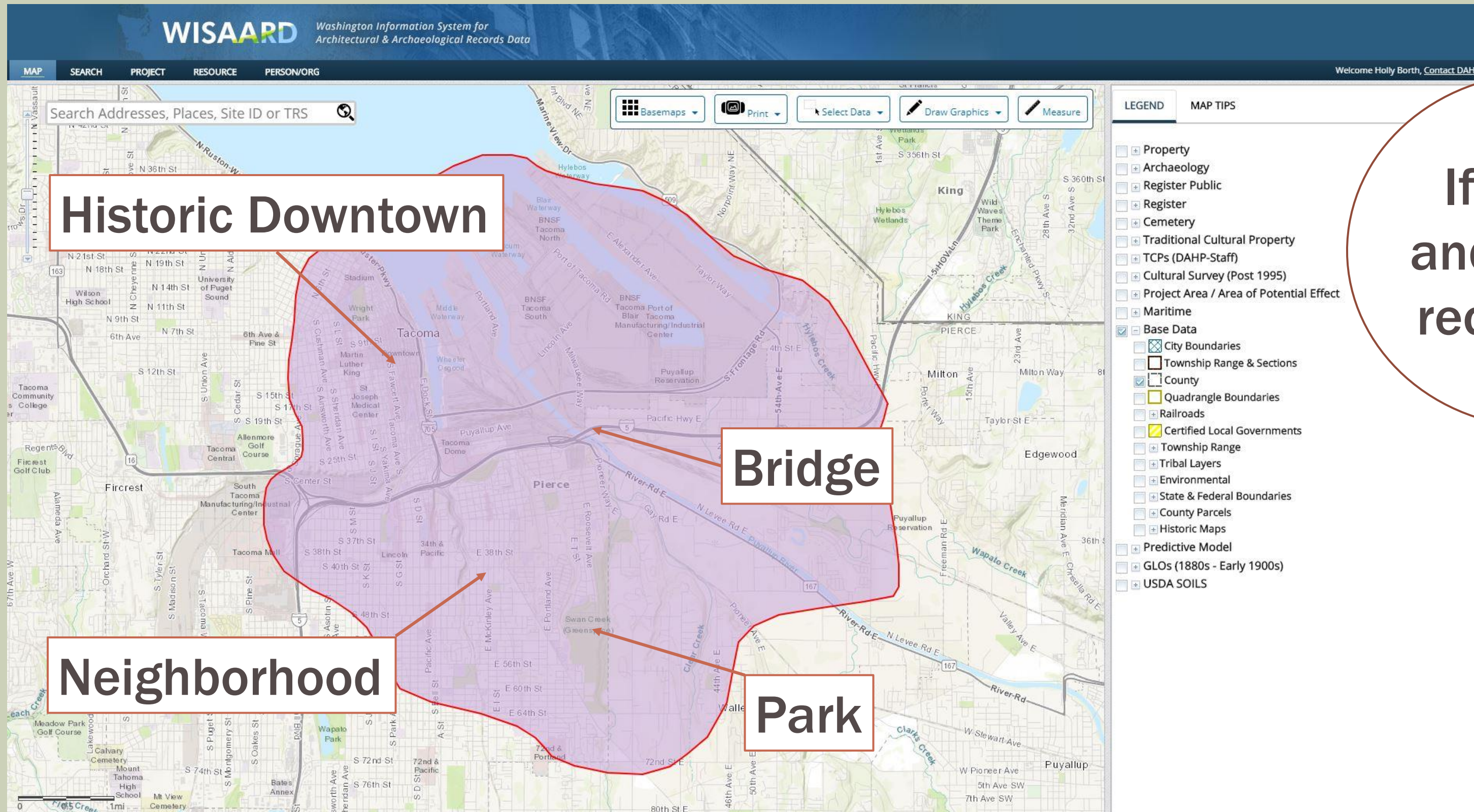
What effects were considered?

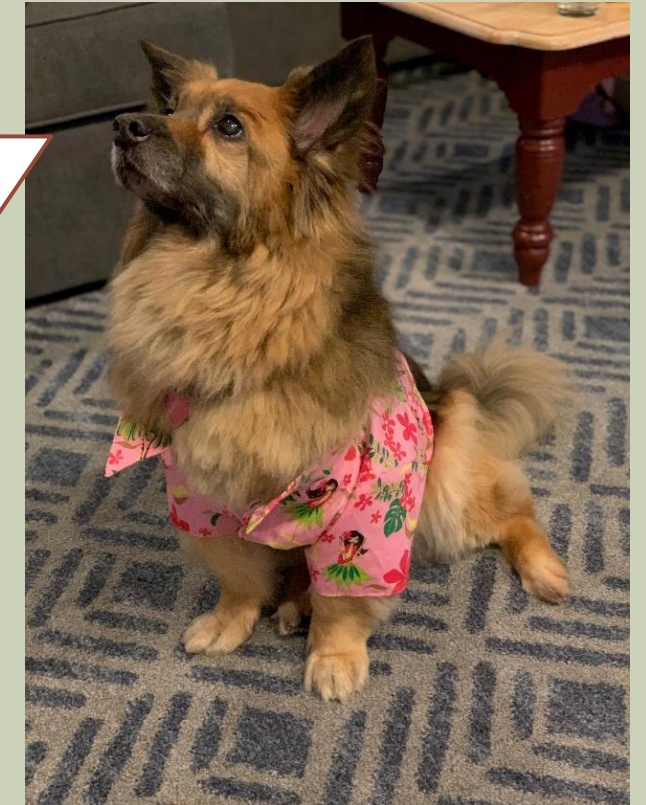
# REPORT

**\*See Standards for Cultural Resource Reporting\***

**Common Topics:**

- **Project Description**
  - Clear and specific
- **Methodology**
  - Justify
- **Historic Context**
  - Specific to the APE/API
- **Survey Results**
  - Align with everything that led up to this

**Shout it  
all out!**



# HISTORIC CONTEXT

## Utilize:

- Previous reports
- Historic maps (GLO, Metsker, Sanborn, Kroll, USGS, etc.)
- Secondary sources (historic newspapers, books, online articles, etc.)





# HISTORIC CONTEXT

Cont'd

- Specific to APE/Project Area
- Relate to historic resources/HPIs that were found
- Don't forget the Post WWII era! ("Historic Period" now enters 1970s)





# SURVEY RESULTS

## Three Essential Components:

1. Data
2. Analysis/Interpretation
3. Recommendations
