Multiple-Sclerosis Clinic to Open

TACOMA, Sept. 6.—Dedication of the new \$250,000 Multiple Sclerosis Clinic Building at St. Joseph's Hospital here Monday will fulfill a dream for Dr. Hinton D. Jones, the clinic's founder and nationally known authority on the dread disease.

The two-story brick and concrete building is the only structure in the world devoted exclusively to treatment of multiple sclerosis. It is one of the few buildings in the West devoted to treatment of a single non-contagious disease.

But more than that, the structure is a monument to the tireless work of Dr. Jones and the recognition by the Sisters of St. Francis of his care of more than 2,000 victims of multiple sclerosis from all parts of the world.

The new building will be open for public inspection tomorrow and Monday afternoons. First patients will be cared for September 15.

The Most Rev. Thomas A. Con-

nolly, archbishop of the Diocese of Seattle, will lay the cornerstone and dedicate the building at 5 o'clock Monday afternoon.

Celebration Banquet

A celebration banquet for 100 invited guests will follow in the Winthrop Hotel. Dr. J. A. Kahl, acting state health director, will represent the public. Dr. Jones will speak.

"I'm going to tell them 'Thank God for what we have,'" Dr. Jones said today. "What more is there I can say?"

The Sisters of St. Francis have underwritten most of the construction, which was financed by a loan from a Tacoma bank.

The building adjoins the hospital nurses' home. It was designed by John W. Maloney, Seattle architect, in accordance with Dr. Jones' ideas. All facilities and equipment are planned especially for the convenience of multiple-sclerosis patients.

Social Life Stressed

Handrails and wide bumper-protected doors have been installed to aid wheelchair patients. There is one large area to be used exclusively as a patient lounge and waiting room, in furtherance of Dr. Jones' belief in the beneficial results of as much normal social life as possible for multiple-sclerosis patients.

Thirty-one treatment cubicles are provided.

The building will care for 200 to 250 patients a day, and greatly relieve the overcrowded conditions in the hospital proper caused by the parade of victims to Dr. Jones' clinic. Some 150 are being treated daily in the hospital now.

Nation-wide Publicity

Dr. Jones has given up most of an extensive private practice to operate the clinic and has refused to accept compensation for his services there. Formerly active in many civic groups, for the past five years he has devoted almost his entire time to the clinic.

Dr. Jones is a former state Republican chairman, but hasn't, he said today, "even been to a precinct caucus in years." He also is a former department commander of the American Legion, but now rarely attends meetings.

He declares that no cures have been made at his clinic, although many of his patients who have shown remarkable recovery from the crippling disease and returned to normal life would disagree.

Despite his modesty, his fame has spread and national publicity has brought to the hospital increasing numbers of patients, hopefully seeking a cure.

Japanese Prelate Says Communism Won't Win There

BOSTON, Sept. 6.—(UP)—The Protestant Episcopal bishop of Japan said today he did not think Communism would succeed in Japan, although "it has been gaining since the end of the occupation."

The Rt. Rev. Michael H. Yasui, primate of Japan, is in Boston to attend the 57th triennial general convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States, which opens tomorrow.

"Social disorder always is the hottest of Communism," the prelate said. "But the Christian church is gaining, too. Last year the Episcopalians, who have 60,000 communicants in Japan, had nearly 5,000 converts."

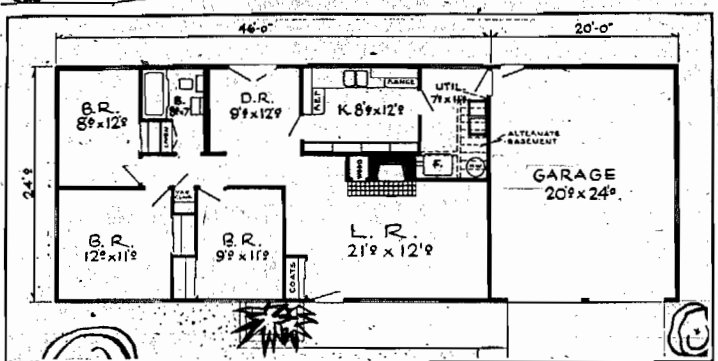
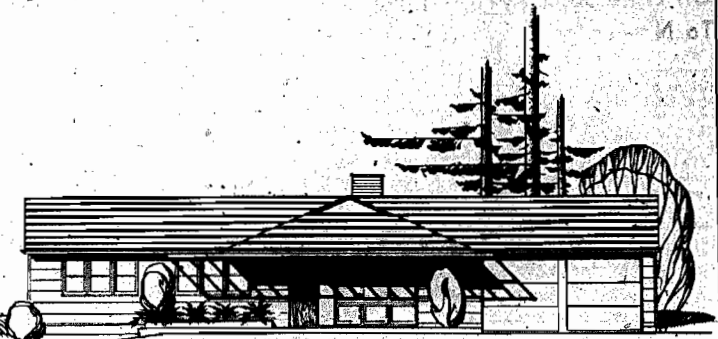
Economy, Space-Saving Feature Home Assembly Plan Cuts Down Costs

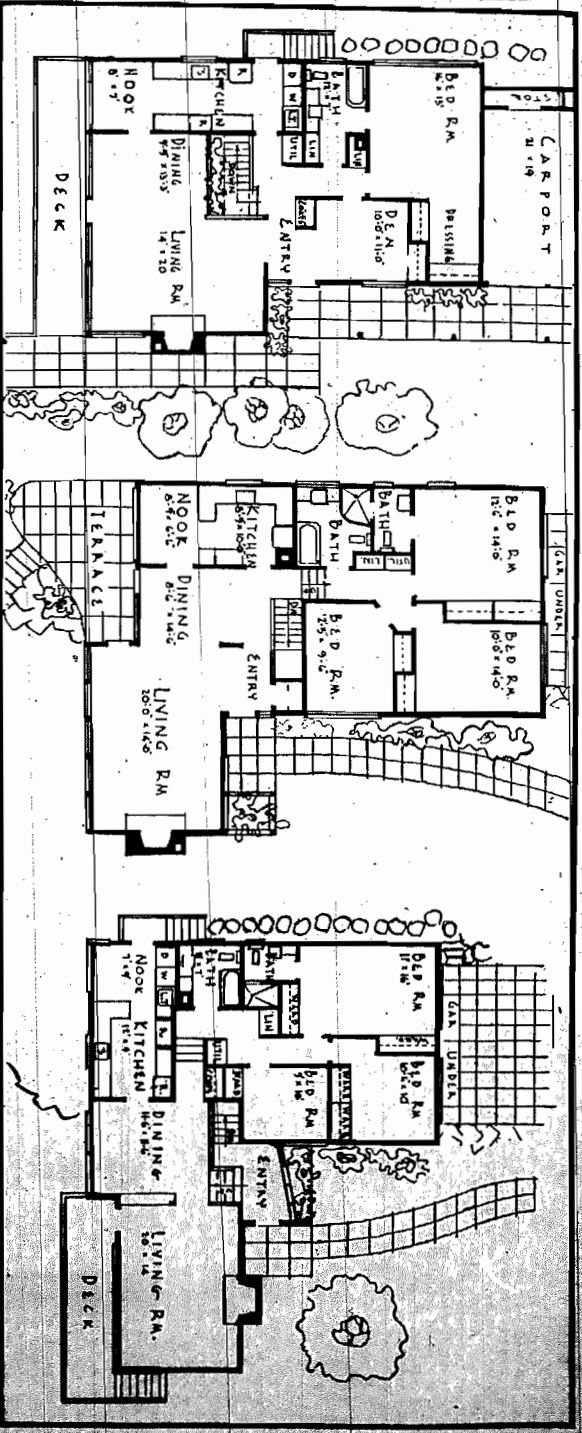

The proximity of a home to a good-sized park has increased its value from \$1,500 to \$3,000, real estate studies show. The park's influence on values may extend for as much as a mile away from its boundary, and the pattern of assessed valuation shows a remarkable stability.

Robert W. Beach, chairman of the Puget Sound Park Study Commission, said last week that Seattle's parks are the most important factor in the value of homes in the city. He said that the value of homes in the vicinity of a park is 20 per cent higher than those in the vicinity of a street.

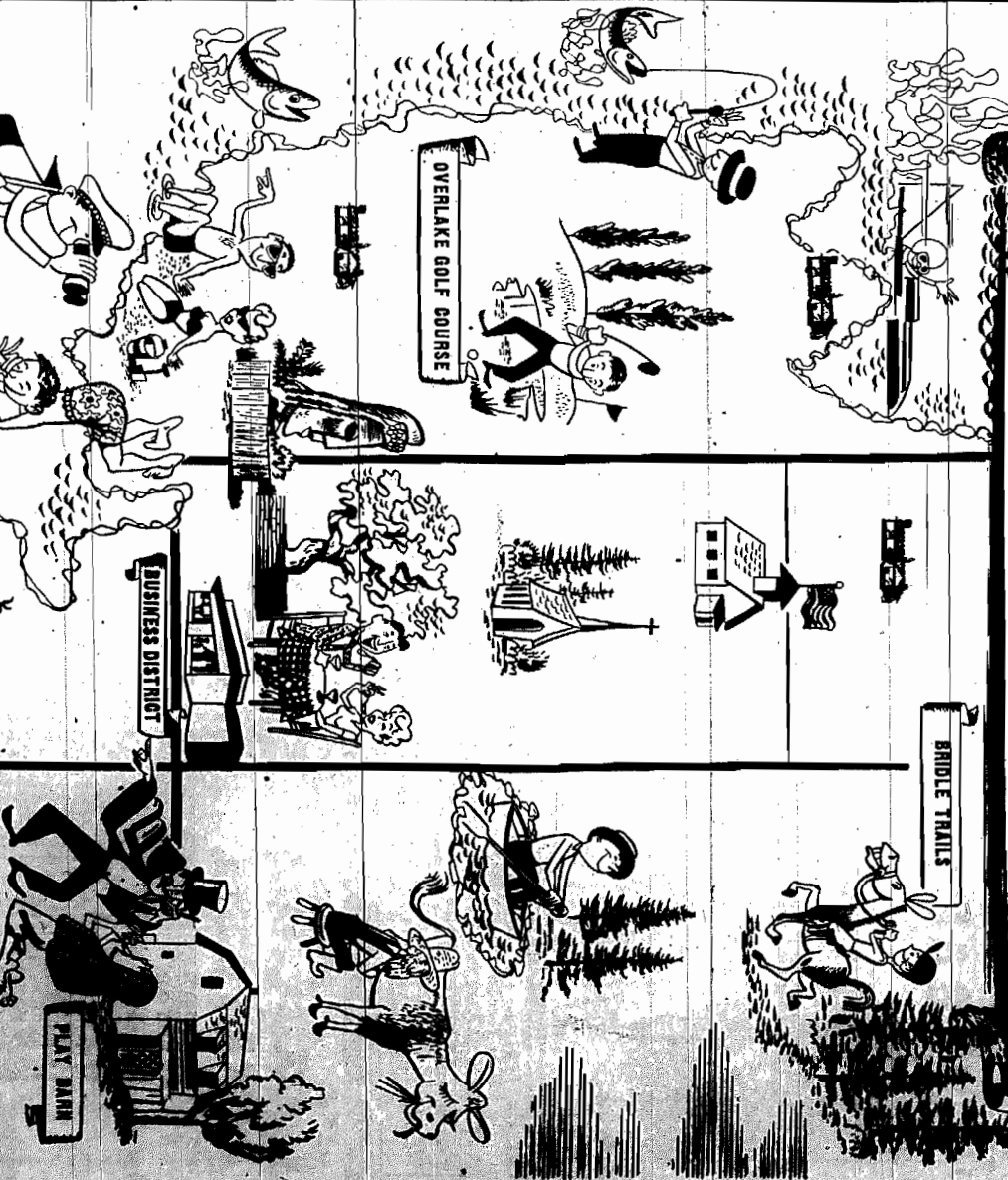

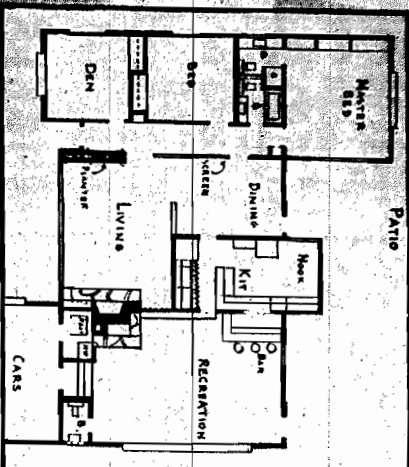

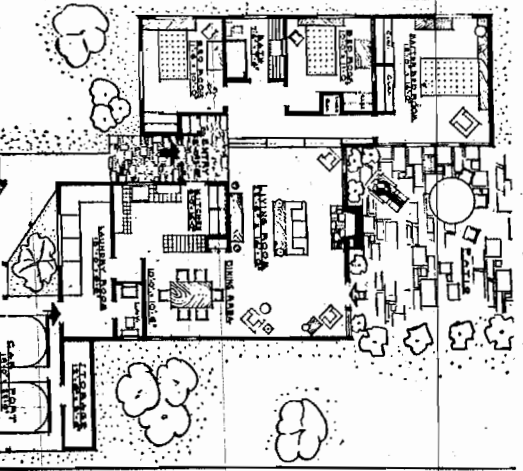

Proper Landscaping Is Important Factor in Livability of Home

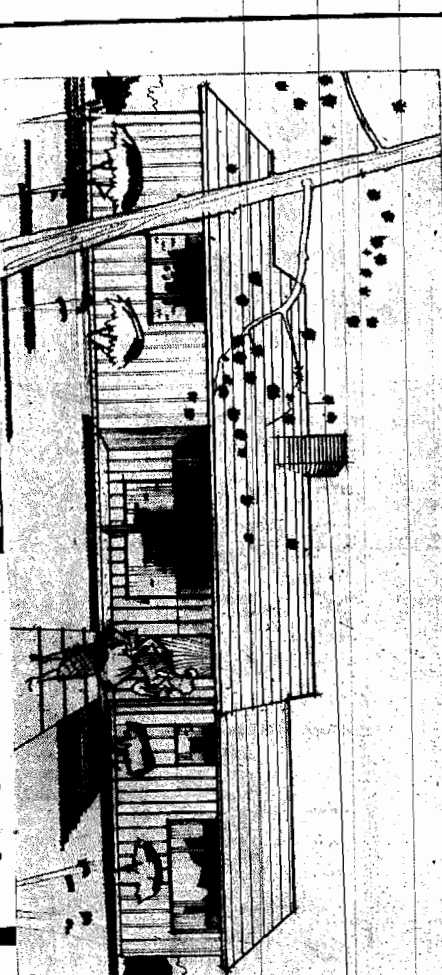

Landscape architects properly plan, design and install plants to use it completely. With houses and property becoming smaller and more expensive, it is no longer feasible to use land only to house a collection of plants. Now we must extend the living area of our facades into the yard to achieve the same effect. Best homelike the landscapers out-planters and grandparents look for granted.

With proper planning, good landscaping should achieve a completely useful and beautiful property. Landscape architects should approach their problems in the house. Architects are concerned not only with an exterior to impress the neighbors, but with an interior arrangement of uses designed for the daily lives of a specific family. Similarly, landscapers architect with the house, not just the exterior. They are concerned with the arrangement of outdoor areas to fill the requirements of those who are to use them.

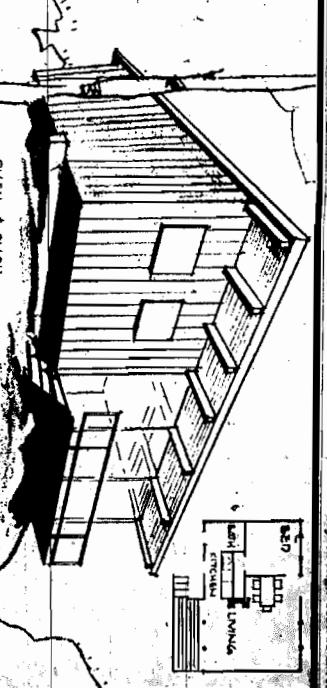

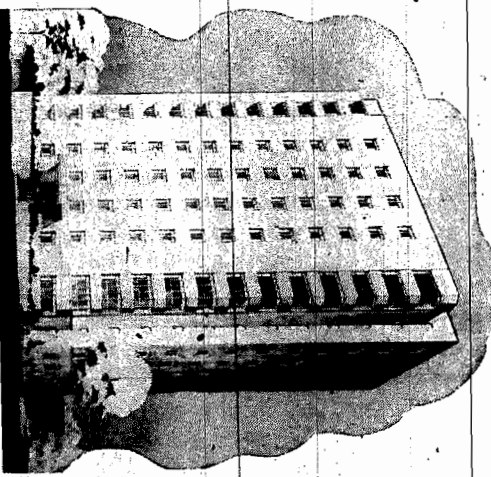
