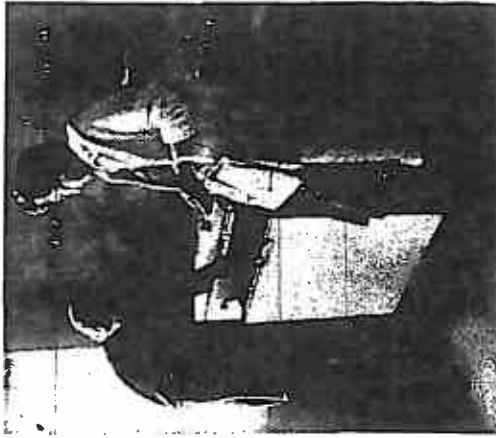
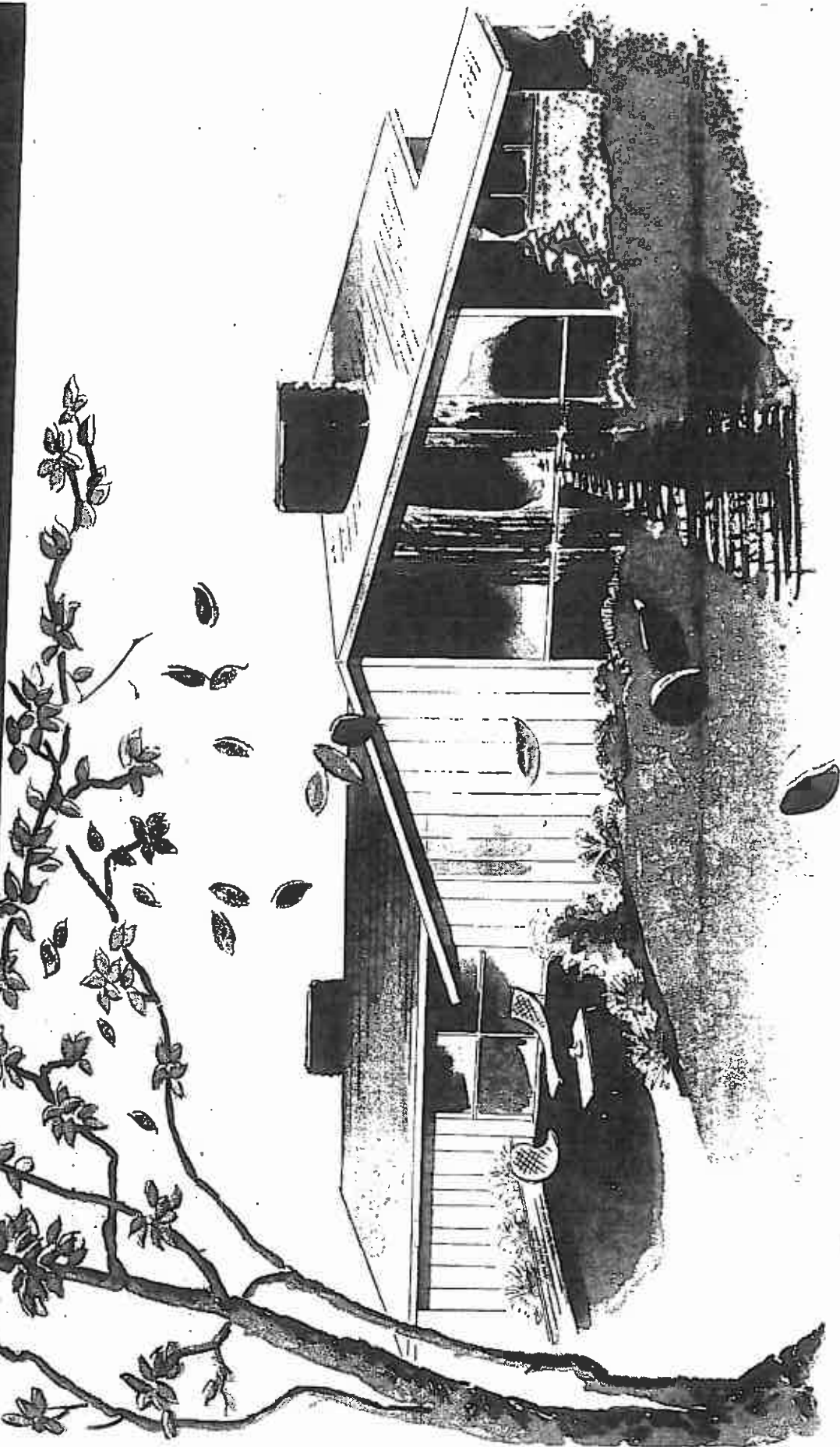
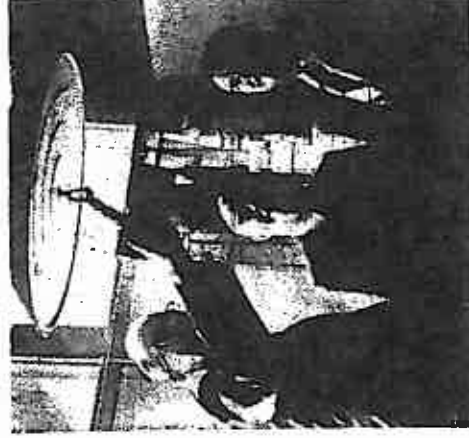

Parade Acclaimed by Prominent Visitors

BY THE SIDE, this annual Parade of Homes section are photographs and comments of several prominent persons. They were guests of The Times in a pre-parade tour, traveling by limousine to three developments on Mercer Island where they saw well-designed homes, typical of those on display throughout the Greater Seattle area this Parade week.

Three guests were invited because they represent industries which supply the materials for new homes here and elsewhere throughout the United States. These guests were Norton Clapp, Weyerhaeuser Co. board chairman; Thomas Gleed, Simpson Timber Co. president, and W. P. Fuller, 3rd, director of the nation-wide paint and glass company which bears his name and which was founded by his grandfather, W. P. Fuller, in 1849.

Airplane Company Represented

Mr. and Mrs. Wellwood Beall, vice president of the Boeing Airplane Co. of Washington, Seattle, and his wife, Mrs. E. D. Stanley, vice president of Boeing employees, numerous as they are, make up a large part of the market for new housing. Mrs. Beall is a noted artist who has designed murals for such buildings as the Penthouse Theater, the Seattle City Light Building and the Penthouse of the Olympic Hotel. She was invited for her knowledge of house design and interior decor.

Mrs. Emily D. Stanley represented newcomers to the city with her husband, Navy Captain Stanley, who is commanding officer of the Naval Supply Depot here. She arrived here in March. Because the Stanleys have lived in many parts of the United States, they are especially well qualified to compare Northwest housing with that of other regions.

San Franciscan Pleased

Fuller, who is on a Seattle from his San Francisco headquarters especially on his new tour, remarked later that the pleasure it gave him to be on the trip well worth while. Beall said this was the first such home tour he had taken in more than 20 years, that he enjoyed every minute and was tremendously impressed.

After a morning of close inspection of the Parade homes, the group met for luncheon in the Rainier Club. There, with Seattle Times executive playing host, they were joined by Lawrence Waldron, president of the American Institute of Architects, Washington Chapter; Mrs. June Sweet, president of the American Institute of Decorators, Pacific Northwest Chapter; Prof. Arthur P. Herrmann, dean of the University of Washington College of Architecture; H. K. Schroeder, president of the Home Builders Association of Greater Seattle; Frank Perkins, president of the Seattle Real Estate Board, and others who had attended with the 1959 Parade of Homes.

Clapp Strikes Keynote

After the luncheon, each guest contributed brief comments to discussion of the Parade that opened today. Norton Clapp struck a keynote when he said:

"The building business is a challenging one, carrying with it huge responsibilities because the value of a new home depends on the character and versatility of the builder. Many persons want to buy a home the way they buy a car, rather than go through the tortuous process of building one themselves. The variety of good thinking that has gone into the new homes we saw on the Parade preview shows that builders are accepting both the burden and the challenge."

TOTAL LIVING—we are sure you will agree with that description when you visit the new residences in rapidly developing communities during the 1959 Parade of Homes.

Total living is a fitting description for today's home—of modest proportion or of spacious size—because never before has the public had an opportunity to select such good design, such quality construction, such an abundance of details that make life more pleasant. Regardless of the size of the home, community planning, site development and time-and-labor-saving devices offer values which had been anticipated for many years.

Everyday Conveniences Now

Since June, 1934, when the first Federal Housing Act was signed, insuring amortized loans on new houses, there has been a steady growth in the housing industry. Ideas that we considered luxuries five years ago are everyday conveniences now. Beautifully planned communities, individually designed homes, houses full of automatic appliances are available for everyone. A few years ago the built-in oven, the counter-top range, the dishwasher, refrigerator-freezer and the washer-dryer were to be found only in expensive homes. Today they are available in homes of modest size and cost.

Outdoor living areas and swimming pools were for the well-to-do. Today, every home has a sliding glass door sometimes as many as four) linking the interior with the site for indoor-outdoor activities. Not all homes have swimming pools but residents in some communities have joined together to provide popular recreation centers, including a pool for all neighbors to enjoy.

Families Brought-Together

And, with this joining of "forces," we find a "togetherness" . . . a new attitude so popular in the American way of life. Due to space restrictions, individual families are brought together more and more by opening living areas, family rooms, play terraces. Our servantless houses require the uniting of such spaces and construction costs demand double duty, flexible rooms.

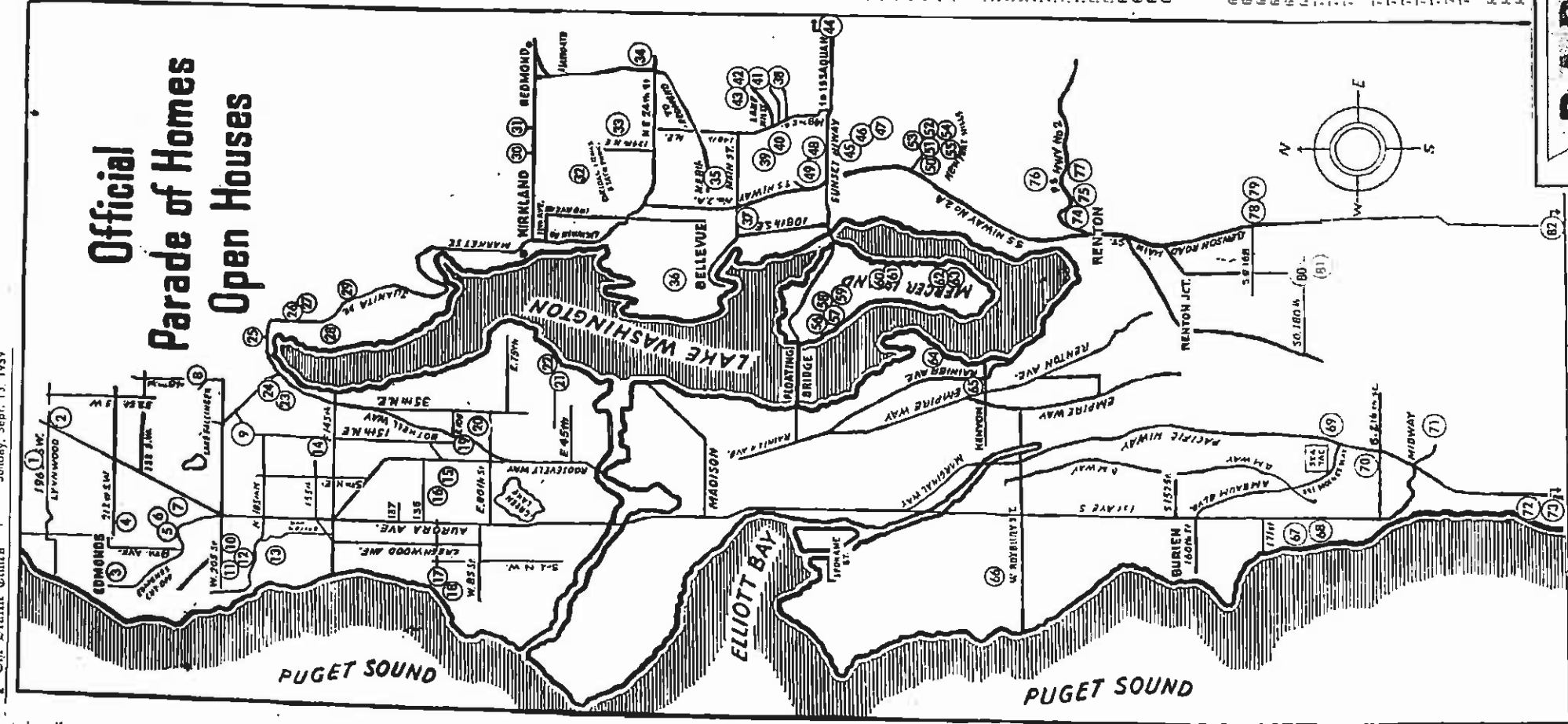
Yet, as you go through the many houses open during the Parade of Homes, you will note that in addition to planning family activities together there is an effort to maintain some privacy so that children and parents may maintain emotional stability. The master bedroom and adjoining bath away from the family room . . . children's room walled for play, divided by folding doors for quiet . . . the separate living room . . . the planning of several outdoor living areas, one for wheeling toys, one for chess lounges . . . all attempt to provide quiet retreats.

Skillful Engineering

Total living indoors means that most comfortable and attractive use of enclosed space . . . the acceptance of the newest and most efficient labor-saving devices . . . the skillful engineering of utility walls that bring the outdoors inside add to the pleasure of living areas. Appliances for labor-saving and convenience—the washer-dryer, the refrigerator-freezer, the water-disposal, and heating equipment and plumbing fixtures scaled for the smaller homes are noteworthy.

Total living outdoors means the utilization of every square foot of property to provide the homeowner with the maximum use of land for which he pays taxes and interest (if his property is mortgaged).

Winding streets, wooded settings, view sites, individually designed homes all suggest the "Total Living" expressed so convincingly in the 1959 Parade of Homes.

Typical Buyer Of Home Is Vet. In Early 30's

Many of the 1,300,000 home-buyers of 1959 will flock to the highways and byways during National Home Week, seeking to realize the dream of most American families: to build or buy their own home.

Who is he, this individual willing to assume the responsibilities of mortgage for 25 to 30 years in order to execute the proclaimed privilege of every American?

He is in his early 30's, he served in the armed forces during the Second World War, went to college or learned a trade after the war, married at 25, has two or three children and expects more.

Income-wise he is in the bracket of 36 per cent of the United States bread-winners whose disposable income this year will be over \$5,000 and under \$8,000. He will pay \$12,000-\$20,000 for his home, and will need three to four bedrooms.

A recreation room is a "must" for his growing family, and he wants it constructed of quality materials, such as durable gramum board and foreboard ceiling like It should be convenient to an extra bath.

Although he played one or more sports in high school and college, and played softball in the service, he now takes most of his organized sports on television. Golf, hunting and fishing are more likely his speed, and he wants a home in the suburbs accessible to these playgrounds.

PLAY AREAS Vital For Teen-agers

Teen-age youngsters is less of a problem in homes where youngsters have play areas they can call their own.

Some builders, cognizant of family efforts to make teenagers "feel at home" now include recreation areas that are actually two rooms, one especially set aside for the young ones.

Others anticipate the need for future expansion by including extra space which the home owner readily can take advantage as needs of the family arise. Still others even include blueprints for later use.

One-half of a double recreation area might be equipped as a library or trophy room for adult use while the other will ensure youngsters to stay home more often.

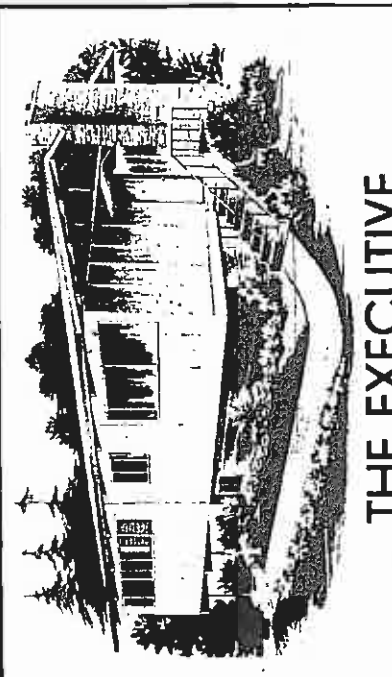

Wise planning for the growing family is noted in the open house situated in Seward Park at 5745 Eddy St. Kenneth E. Large view windows in the living area open to the view of Lake Washington. A sliding glass door opens onto a covered deck. Walls are a soft pink-beige tone to complement the off-white of the smartly designed fireplace and planters.

The cherry-yellow family room has sliding glass doors at either end, one opening into the view deck for dining, the other onto a screen-fenced court for sunning.

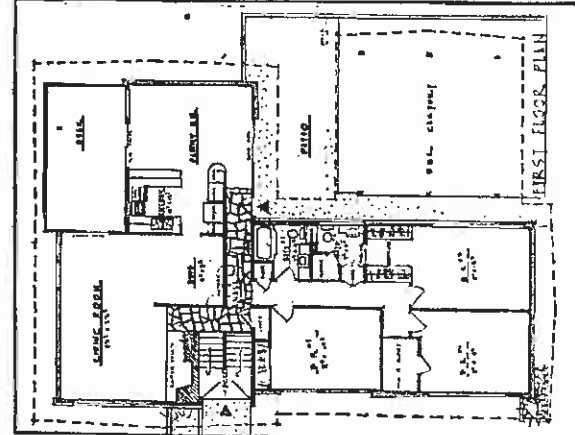

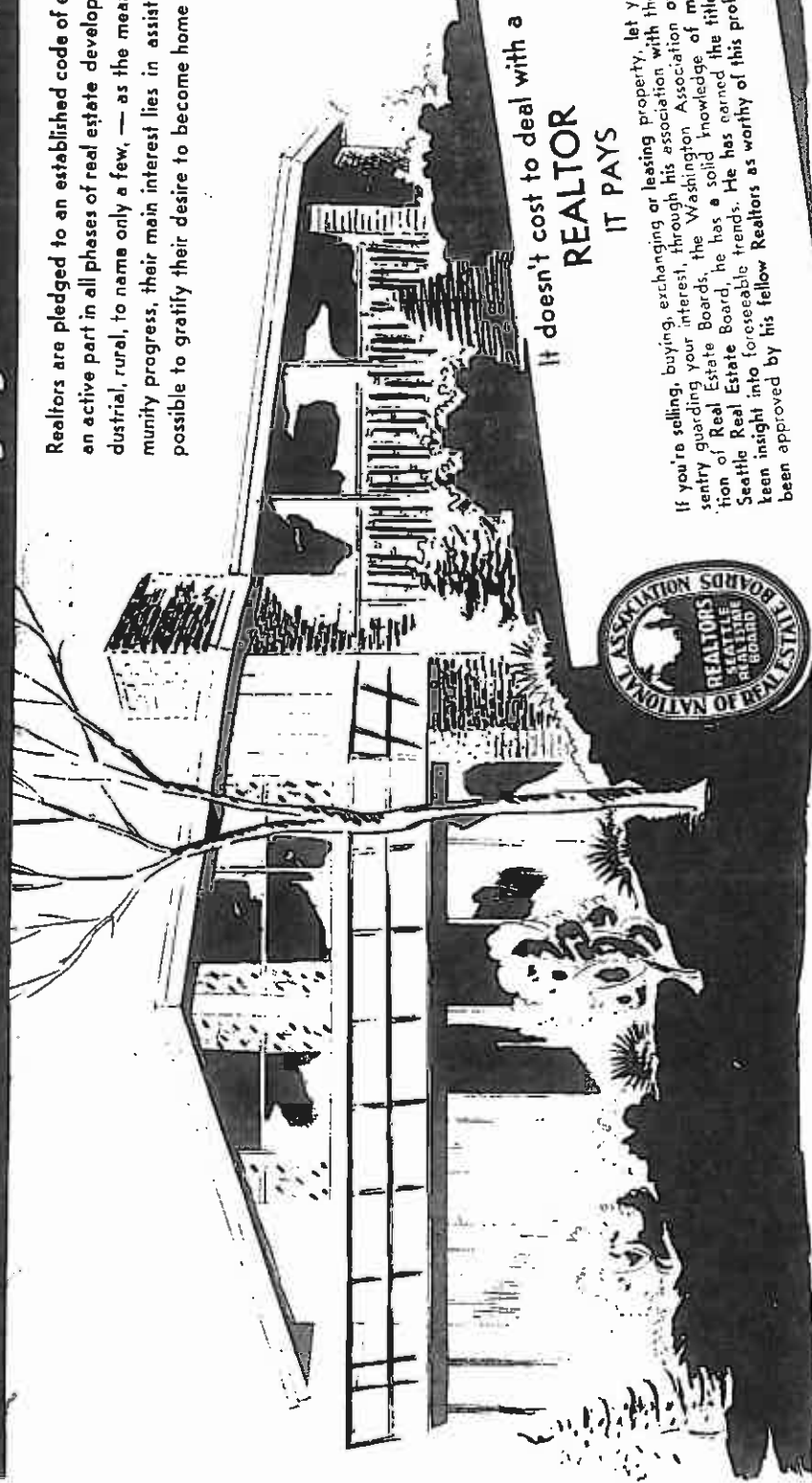

Property Might Augment Income

(The following questions were submitted at the Home Buyers' Forum in March. Because there was not time to answer all questions at the forum, the answers are appearing in the following Times. All questions were asked by Roy F. Taylor, president of the Puget Sound Mutual Savings Bank, one of the forum panelists.)

Question: Can a retired individual with a fixed income of \$300 a month augment his income with a three-plex or four-plex?

Answer: There is no reason why a retired individual cannot invest in income property. It is assumed that a mortgage or contract is contemplated. The income from the investment should service the debt and provide payment of maintenance and expenses. This may require a substantial equity.

Question: If a home is advertised for sale for \$12,000 and the ad asks for "only \$100 down," does this include closing costs or do you have to dig down for more money to answer the deal?

Answer: Ordinarily use of the word "down" alone means that closing costs would be in addition. "Down" is a contraction of down payment. The usual terminology used when costs are included shown in this week's Parade would be "300 down, including costs."

Question: Suppose a person wanted to build a \$23,000 home on his own lot. The lot, in 1942, only 6 per cent of the time of purchase. The planned down payment was \$7,000 and the person's credit is very good. He has a nominal bank account, a portfolio of growth common stocks and has been employed for eight years at the same place.

Answer: The term and amount seem probable in the market conditions. However, the interest rate would be subject to conditions. Mortgage rates are higher than 3 1/2 per cent now. **Question:** Do most financial institutions require a penalty clause if you exceed your mortgage payments or choose to pay off your existing contract to take advantage of a lower interest rate available elsewhere? **Answer:** If there is one phase of the mortgage business that varies from institution to institution, it is the matter of prepayment penalties and payoff penalties. Penalty would range from no restriction at all to a completely closed rule with no prepayment permitted. There is no prepayment penalty on a G. 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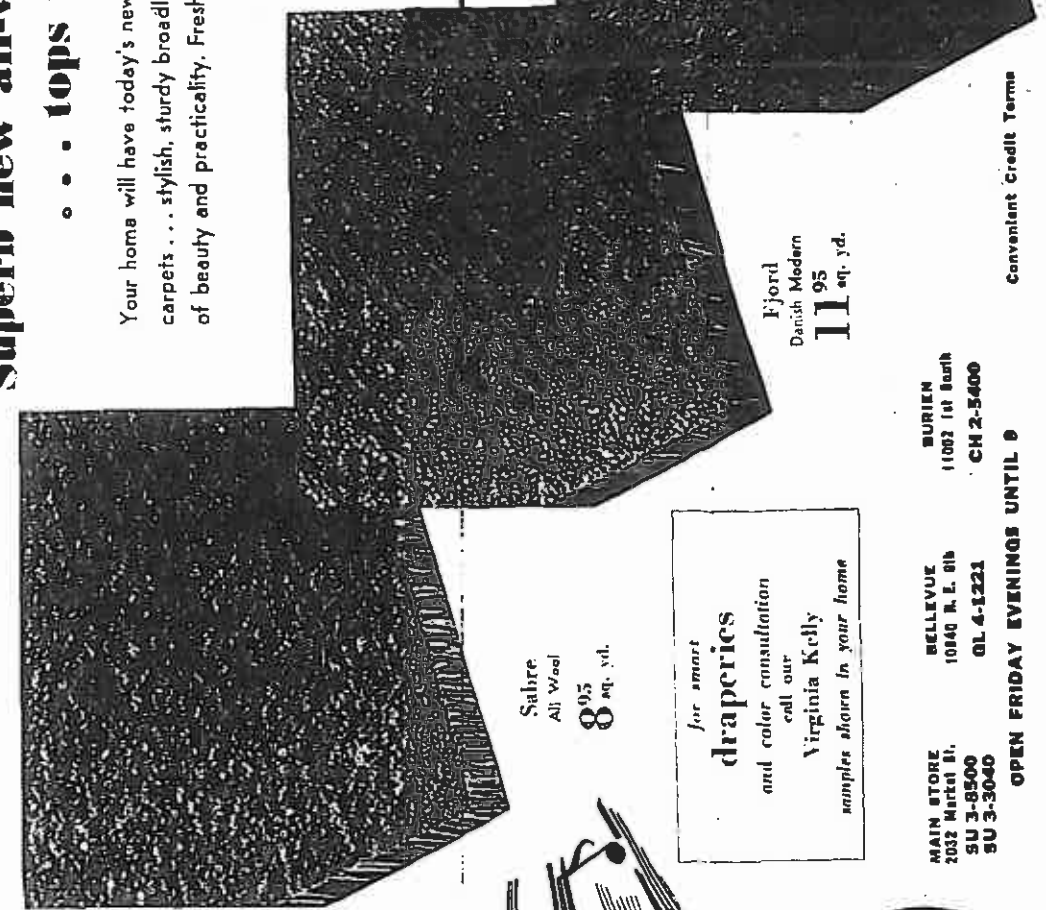

Barn-red siding and sparkling white brick are a happy combination for the one-level suburban house in the Parade of Homes at 18936 33rd Av. S. 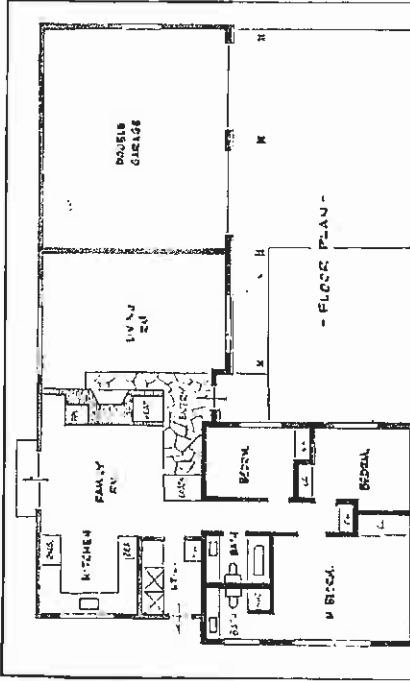
Next to the kitchen is a utility room . . . mud room for the children as they come in from play, and laundry room for mother.

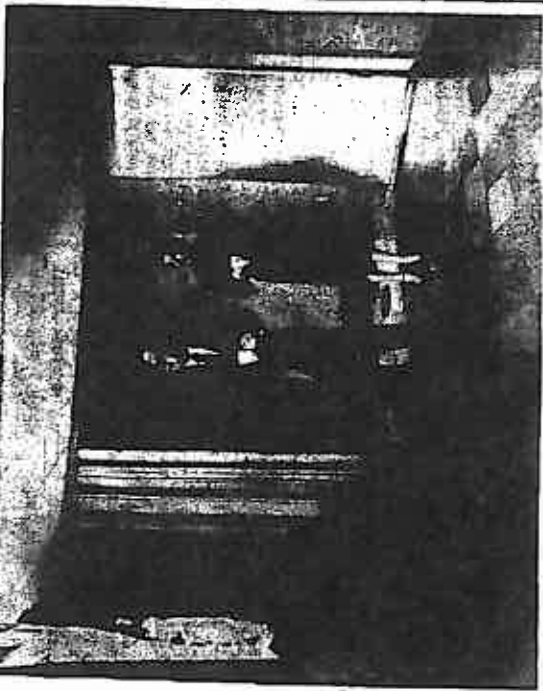

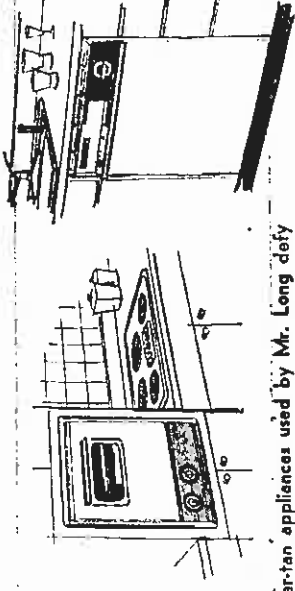


Sweeping View of City Skyline and Lake Washington

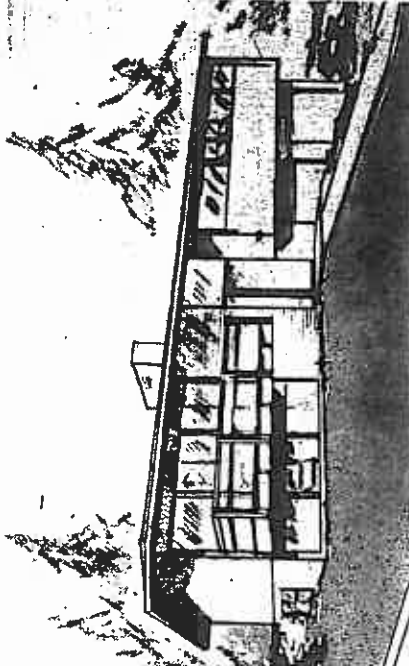

The living and dining area is planned in L-shape, with sliding glass doors opening onto a view-deck from the living room and sliding glass doors opening onto a paved patio from the dining space. The "old" brick of the fireplace, (actually, new brick masonry) makes it look old and mellow. Forms a colorful, textured wall for the living area. The kitchen, in compact mid-level plan, allows space for a breakfast area. This also opens onto the patio through sliding glass doors.

Wardrobe is large. Three bedrooms are placed on the upper level. The master bedroom has a view to wall wardrobe and shower bath. The two smaller bedrooms share a family bath. All bedrooms have high windows and a maximum of natural light and allowing furniture arrangements on the window wall.

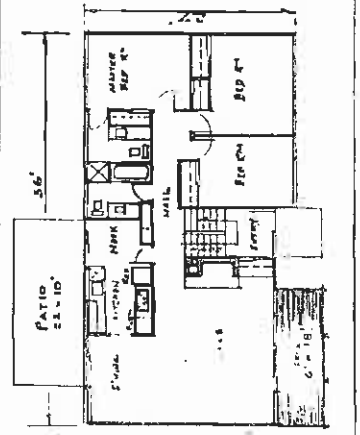
On the lower level there is a recreation room with fireplace. This could serve as a fourth bedroom or study. In addition there is a laundry and a large two-car garage.

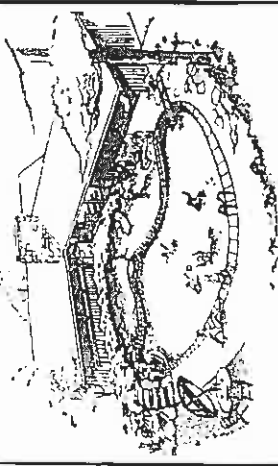

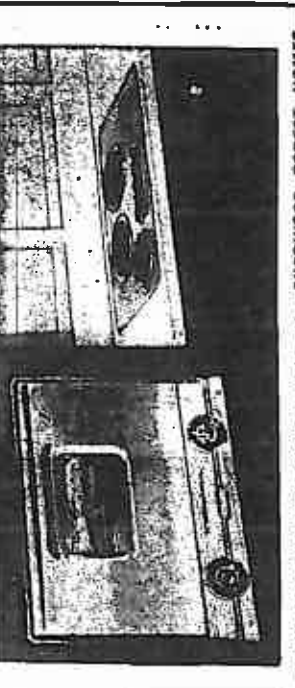
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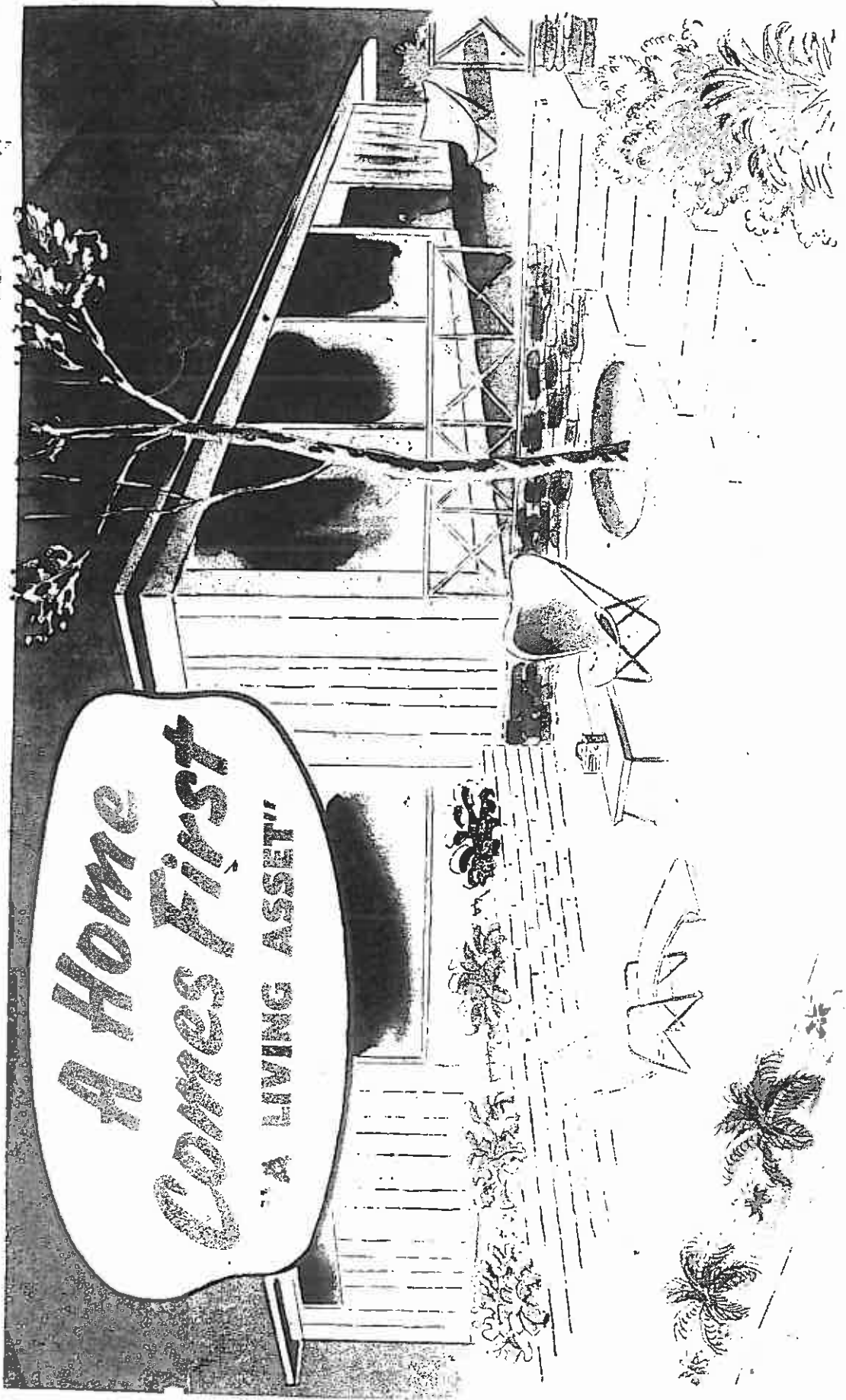
