Firts project as principal in 1947 , Norway Center, started by Naramore Bain Brady, Architects, E. K. Mahlum, Associated Architect, project completed by Edward Kristian Mahlum Architect, Naramore Bain Brady Johanson, Consulting Architects. Except for the war years, I had acted as architect in charge of Mr. Naramore's office since 1940, Central Building, and later Dexter Horton Building, Seattle, Washington. During 1947 and 1948 I did more and more work as a principal, and at the end of 1948 opened a new office at 1305 Republican Street, Seattle, Washington. In 1949 I moved to the Jonas Building, in 1952 to the Central Building, and in January this year to this location. During the years from 1952 to 1957 I also assisted Mr. John W. Maloney in running his office (of about 50 architects) when his right hand man, Mr. Minoy, had a heart attack, in addition to carrying on my own practice.

I am at the present time architect for the Norse Home Inc for an addition, the Educational facilities addition to the Phinney Ridge Latheran Church, Seattle-\$ 275,000; High School Addition at San Juan Island-\$ 175,000; the Bardahl Residence, \$150,000; The Bardahl Tank Farm Addition-\$ 250,000; the Waldahl Residence \$ 60,000; and I am retained by three groups to design retirement homes similar to the \$ 1,500,000 Norse Home which I completed last year. In addition there are two other groups in Oregon who want me to design retirement homes for them. I am also architect for a 400,000 dollar nursing home addition proposed for the Columbia Conference Home here in Seattle.

During the past ten years I have done considerable study and research on geriatrics and I have for the past two years served as a member of the Washington Association of Homes for the Aged. During a conference in Washington D. C. in 1956 with Mr. Albert Cole, Housing Administrator, I personally requested funds from the President for FNMA for housing for the aged, and the President set aside 20 million dollars for this purpose, an act which started the FHA program for the nation. The Norse Home here became the first project in the nation for the aged under FHA insured mortgage. I am also consulting architect to the Supreme Lodge Sons of Norway which last August adobted my plan for them to build retirement homes throughout the nation.

Dear Mr. Smay:

In looking over your letter dated November 26, 1958, I am wondering if my many years of experience over and above the 10 years required as a principal would not be considered more than the equivalent to the one year I am short because of having attended a non-accredited college?

Since graduation in June, 1934, I have been working continuously in architectural offices, except for 3½ years in the army and ½ year travel-study in Europe, or for a total of twenty (20) full years as of June, 1958.

Subtracting the 11 years I reported as a principal, that leaves still 9 full years to make up for the year I lack in college. It seems to me that your line 106 "Graduation from an accredited school of architecture or the equivalent" of Part III, Senior Classification, should rule me eligible with four years college, nine years experience plus eleven years as a principal, for a total of 24 years.

If I am still wrong in this, please advise me. The chairman of the State of Washington architectural licensing board, Mr. Kenneth Branch, who knew of my experience here thought I may have failed to advise you properly of all my experience in addition to the 11 years I reported to you in the application, as a principal.

For the record, the following is a brief record of my experiences in addition to those previously reported:

- 1934-1938: Designer and chief draftsman, Ross & Co., Architects, Fergus Falls, Minnesota. (Now 26 North Fair Street, Moorhead, Minn.)
- 1938-1940: Senior Draftsman, C. H. Johnson, Architects, 715 Empire Bank Building, St. Paul, Minnesota, architects for the University of Minnesota, where I participated in the planning of several buildings including the Student Union Building, Museum of Natural History, etc.
- 1940-1948: Naresmore & Brady (later Naresmore Bain Brady Johanson) Architects, Seattle, Washington. My duties here were described earlier in letter to you dated December 2, 1958.

Mr. Branch will give me a written four hour exam if you still think that is needed. Please advise me at your early convenience.




BERO RESIDENCE 1916 31st AVENUE WEST, SEATTLE, WASHINGTON VIEW FROM NORTHWEST




